Next Australian National Championships

The next nationals will be held in 2007 in Sydney. Robert Vadas will be tournament director.

AGA Revenue Increase

JH proposed that the AGA take 10% of all entry fees to AGA tournaments. This would be seen as a charge for the credit points earned.

Clarification requested: Some tournaments (Toyota-Denso?) are sponsored and so have no entry fees. Would this be 10% of sponsorship as well?

Clarification requested: What about kyu players, who don't earn credit points?

DB was concerned at increasing revenue when the AGA was already in surplus. JH felt that little could be done with the AGA's present budget, and an increase in revenue had to precede new initiatives.

Some concern expressed that increased entry fees might deter players from attending or clubs from organising. JH felt that clubs were more likely to seek external sponsorship if they had to pay this tax.

Suggested modification: Charge a percentage of prizes. Rejected, partly because some prizes were non-cash or sponsored.

Modification: charge to be voluntary for now. Accepted.

Motion (JH, NS) 10 in favour, 3 against; carried.
