2025 NSW Go Championships

Introduction

The 2025 NSW Go Championships will be held at the Ryde Eastwood Leagues Club, 117, Ryedale Road, West Ryde on Sunday 22nd June 2025.

The event is open to all Go players but because of space limitations there is a limit of 50 players. When the 50 player limit is reached new registrations will be placed in a wait list.

Rules, terms & conditions

Ryde-Eastwood RSL

All participants and visitors to the tournament must comply with the Ryde-Eastwood By-laws (https://www.releagues.com.au/227) some of the key points are:

- Everybody must be a member of the club or register on entry using a driving licence or identity card.
- Persons under 18 must be accompanied by an adult who is responsible for the child's behaviour
- Persons under 18 are not allowed into the gaming machine areas nor are they allowed to attempt to purchase of consume alcoholic drinks.
- People are not allowed to bring food or drink into the club.
- The club accepts no responsibility for personal effects including mobile phones.

Tournament rules

All players must comply with the AGA tournament rules and Code of Conduct, failure to do so may result in the loss of a game or disqualification from the tournament.

In order to ensure there is a clear winner in each division, there is a limit of 16 people in each division. The Tournament Director will determine the divisions when player registration is completed.

Tournament management:

Game adjudication & dispute process:

The event must adhere to a tight timetable, games lasting longer than 85 minutes will be adjudicated by the Tournament Referee (using AI technology if appropriate). In the event of a dispute, the Tournament Referee and Tournament Director will decide the matter, their decision is final.

Refreshment:

Refreshment including a light lunch will be provided as part of the entry fee. Unfortunately, no provision can be made for people with special dietary needs.

Prizes:

There will be trophies for the first three places in the Open division and medals and certificates for the Dan handicap, Kyu handicap and juniors.
